#1

Organise your units early! Finding matching units can be tricky, so save your electives and plan to go earlier in your degree as you'll have more units to choose from!

#2

When applying for scholarships, use the many resources available at your university (study abroad, careers, leadership and scholarship services) and seek advice from students who have been through the process before!

#3

Do your research! Learning more about Japan and specifically the location and university you wish to study at will only help you when applying for scholarships or during application interviews!

Eligibility Criteria

- be an Australian citizen (not be a current citizen or permanent resident of their proposed location)
- be between (as of 1 January 2026):
 - 18 and 30 years of age (inclusive) for non-Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants;
 OR
 - 18 and 35 years of age (inclusive) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants
- be enrolled in a bachelor's degree or bachelor's honours degree at Curtin University at the time of application and remain admitted throughout your Scholarship program
- be at least in the second year of your degree when the Scholarship program commences (e.g. completed at least 200 credits in your degree)





Eligibility Criteria

- meet the semester exchange program eligibility listed on the Curtin Go Global semester and year-long exchange programs
- be enrolled as a full-time student at a host university in the Indo-Pacific region and receive full credits towards your course of study at Curtin
- not be undertaking another Australian Government funded offshore scholarship at the commencement of, or concurrently with the Scholarship program
- not be a previous recipient of an NCP Scholarship
- not be an employee of the branch of DFAT that administers the NCP





Selection Criteria

- Your NCP study plan
- Academic merit at tertiary level (25%)
- Leadership and engagement in the community (25%)
- Adaptability and resilience (25%)
- Ability to contribute to the NCP's strategic objective and outcomes (25%)
- CV, outlining work experience, community engagement activities and extra-curricular interest
- 2 referee reports to attest your abilities and suitability to receive the scholarship (potential, attributes and values matching with NCP goals)





Action Plan

- 1. Contact course coordinator for units and see if you have units to match
- 2. Which country / university and why
- 3. Begin contacting university / start organizing with Go Global. Get conditional acceptance!
- 4. Structure your NCP scholarship program
- 5. Get referees Select them carefully and give them maximum time
- 6. Write application and seek feedback (You have control of this)
- 7. Submit your Expression of Interest by 29 June 2025





2025 Key Dates

- 29 June Expression of Interest close at Curtin
- Late July Outcome of nomination process
- Late July Feedback Session for nominated applicants
- Late July Nominated applications receive an invitation to apply directly at the NCP website
- Late July Applications webinar by NCP (virtual)
